On or about November 7, 2025, Mountain Water District will file an application with the Kentucky Public Service Commission for the purpose of adjusting its monthly rates for water service. Mountain Water District proposes to charge the following rates for water service:

Mountain Water District further proposes to increase the amount of a deposit required to secure a residential account from \$75.00 to \$114.00, an increase of \$39.00 or 52 percent, and a deposit required to secure a commercial account from \$150.00 to \$190.00, an increase of \$40.00 or 26.67 percent.

Unless suspended by the Kentucky Public Service Commission, the proposed rates and proposed adjustments to account deposit requirements will take effect on December 10, 2025.

The Kentucky Public Service Commission has established Case No. 2025-00327 to review Mountain Water District's application. Any person may examine this application at Mountain Water District's office, Mountain Water District, 6332 Zebulon Highway, Pikeville, Kentucky or at the Kentucky Public Service Commission's offices at 211 Sower Boulevard, Frankfort, Kentucky, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., or through the Public Service Commission's Web site at <https://psc.ky.gov/Case/ViewCaseFilings/2025-327>.

The rates contained in this notice are the rates proposed by Mountain Water District. However, the Kentucky Public Service Commission may order rates to be charged that differ from the proposed rates. Such action may result in rates for consumers other than the rates in this notice.

A person may submit a timely written request for intervention to the Kentucky Public Service Commission, P.O. Box 615, Frankfort, Kentucky 40602, establishing the grounds for the request including the person's status and interest. If the Kentucky Public Service Commission does not receive a written request for intervention within thirty (30) days of the initial publication of notice, it may take final action on the proposed rates.
